

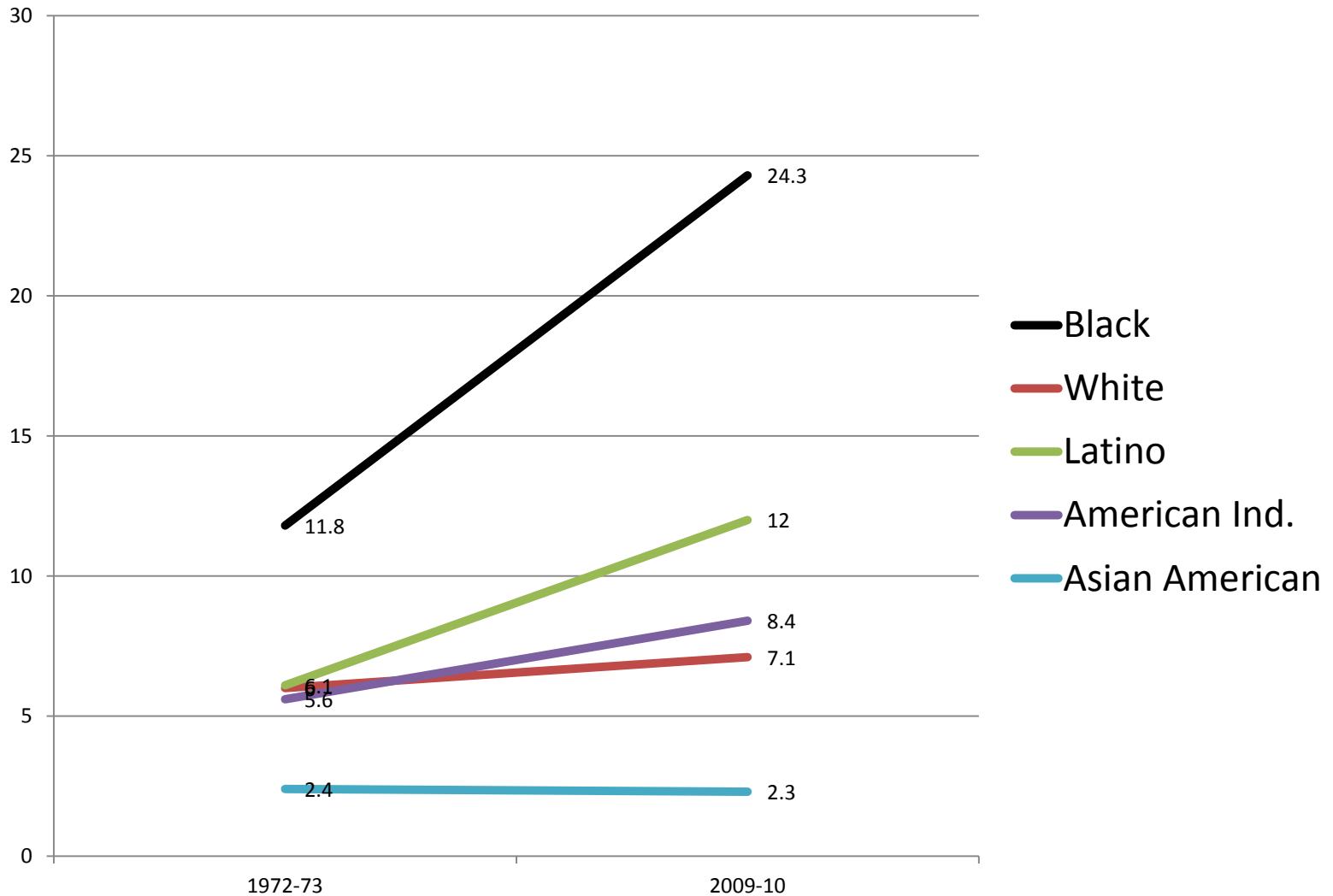

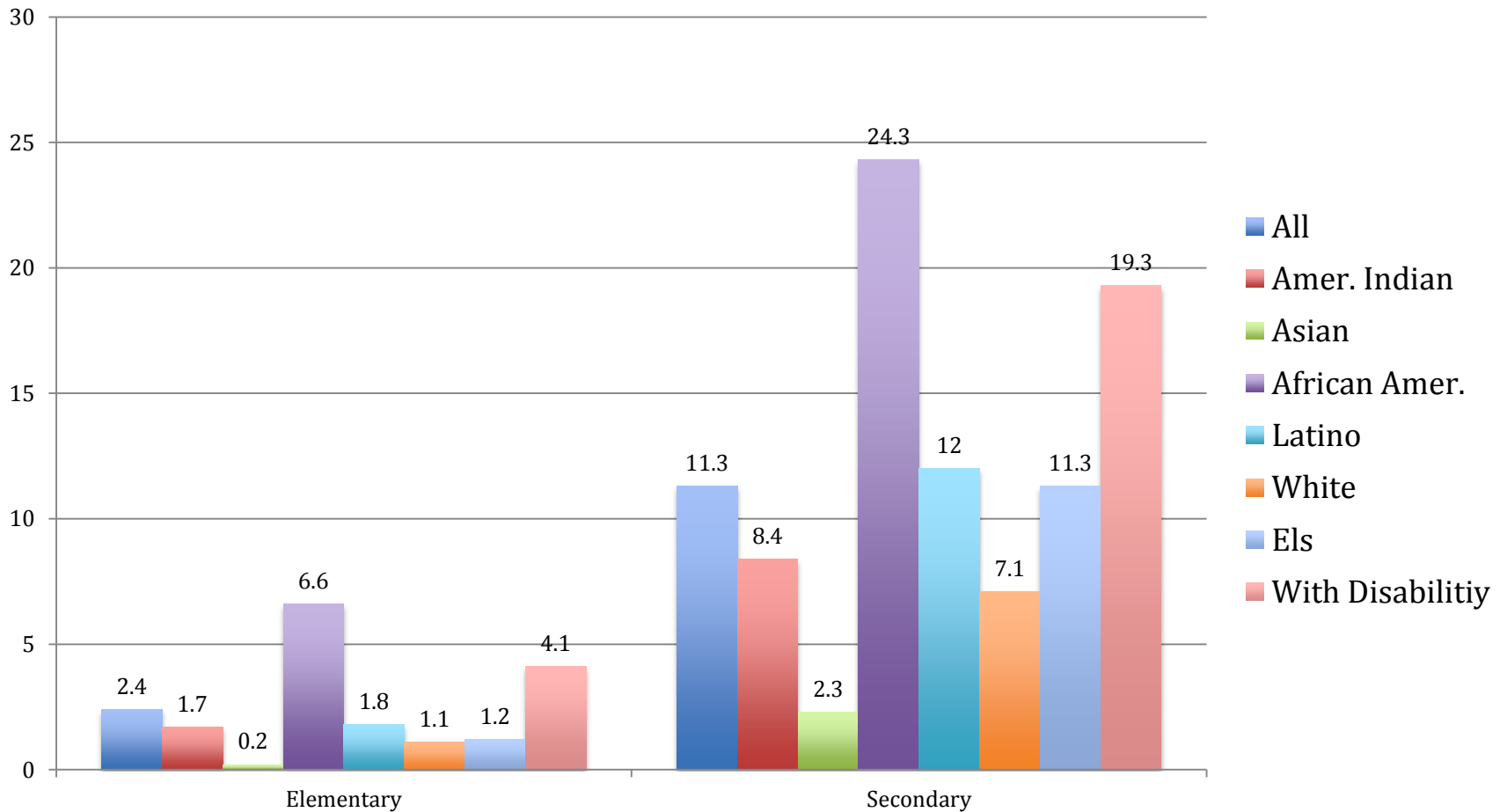

Secondary Suspension Rates: Then and Now



National Data (2009-10) Show Suspension Rates at the Secondary Level are Typically 4 to 10 Times Higher Than Elementary Level

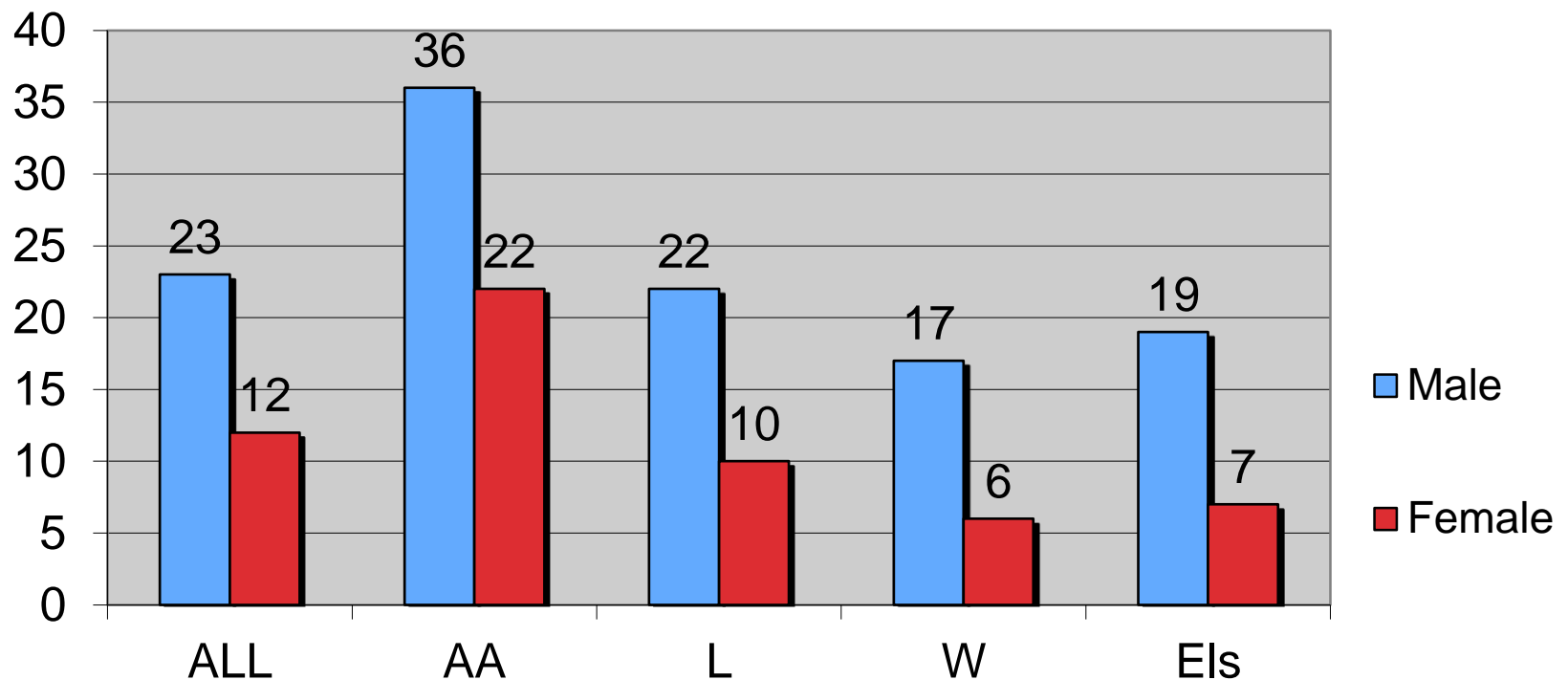


**National District Distribution of Secondary Level Suspension Rates for Black Students
(Number of Districts)**

Percent of Total Enrollment Suspended	0 to 9.99 %	10 to 19.99 %	20 to 24.99 %	25 % or above
Number of Districts	1023	795	344	761
