


What is School Climate? 4 Components



Suspensions Declined in SY1213 -


After a 24% decline from 2012 to 2013, suspensions are at an all-time low

Activities

- Established a common, research-based definition of school climate for the District
- Highlighted the link between school climate and student achievement
- Emphasized that positive school climates can be created through planning

- Provided guidance and school-specific data to drive climate planning
- Introduced year long SST and other supports
- Created Climate training module for use at the school level
- Climate training and support continued throughout the *entire* school year

- Focus on understanding the *whole* child
