Linked Learning - OUSD's primary high school reform strategy to support our goal that all students graduate college, career, and community ready

27 Linked Learning Pathways in 13 High Schools

43% of OUSD Students are Enrolled in Linked Learning Pathways

Linked Learning

Requires increased learning time for <u>teachers</u> and students

Origins of Skyline's Increased Learning Time

- Impetus (2010) → Promising results when Skyline High's freshmen teachers shared common "planning" time at
 - Freshmen teachers taught four classes
 - One period for individual preparation
 - One period for collaboration with other teachers
 - Collaborative teachers shared common content or common students
 - = Six Period day

Skyline's 7-Period Day

- —ALL teachers on campus:
 - Instruct five classes
 - Have two periods without students
 - Have one traditional preparation period
 - Have one period for daily collaboration with colleagues who share content or students
- → Increased learning time for TEACHERS

Teacher Collaboration

- Behaviors of Teaching and Learning
 - Analysis of Student Work
 - Common Instructional Practices
 - Peer Observations
- Integrated Curriculum & Project Based Learning
 - Aligned to Pathway theme (i.e. Education, Green Energy, Computer Technology)
- Personalized Student Support
 - College planning, social-emotional support, career planning

Benefits of 7-Period Day

Students have more opportunities

- Remediate courses previously failed
- Take additional electives
 - Career Technical Education Courses
 - AP Courses
 - Physical Education
- Engage in work-based learning
 - Internships
 - Outside work experience
 - Inside work experience (i.e. teachers aid or peer tutor)
 - Job Shadowing
- → Higher Graduation Rates

Additional Opportunities for Increased Learning Time

- Summer internships for all Juniors enrolled in a Linked Learning Pathway (ECCCO)
 - Students gain 21st-Century Skills
 - Students engage in work-based learning
 - Students earn 10 elective credits
- Summer Institute for Teachers
 - One-three week PD for Linked Learning teachers to design integrated curriculum, pathway outcomes, etc.
- 8-Period Block Schedule
 - Increases opportunity for teacher collaboration and student course completion

Linked Learning in OUSD

- Graduation rate (2013-14) for Linked Learning Pathway students in OUSD was 83% compared to 65% for non-pathway students
- High School suspension rates are 17.0% lower for pathway students versus non-pathway students
- 57% of CPA* students fulfilled the courses required for admission to UCs or CSUs compared to 36% statewide
