
The Missing Middle—Federal Funding by Grade Span, Fiscal Year (FY) 2017

Notes: This analysis assumes that the FY 2017 mandatory funding level for CCDBG will be the same as FY 2016. SSAEG is a new program under the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015. Since SSAEG has not been implemented yet, precise data on the distribution of these funds is not available. This analysis distributes SSAEG funds proportionally across birth–grade 5, grades 6–8, and grades 9–12. The TRIO allocation for grades 9–12 is based on the most recent available data on the distribution of funds across TRIO programs.
