Senate Education Committee Votes to Recommend DeVos as Education Secretary

This afternoon, the Senate education committee split along party lines, but voted to endorse Betsy DeVos as the nation's next secretary of education. The final step in the process will be a confirmation vote in the full Senate that has yet to be scheduled. "Federal Flash," the Alliance's five-minute video series on education policy in Washington, DC, will provide further details later this week.



How Three School Systems Are Improving Student Achievement Using the OECD Test for Schools

The Alliance for Excellent Education and the Johns Hopkins Institute for Education Policy released a new case study today on how three school systems are using an assessment developed by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) to monitor students' academic outcomes and inform shifts in policy and teacher practice to meet students' learning needs.

Superintendents, principals, and teachers can look to the case study to learn how Gwinnett County Public Schools in Georgia; Granger Independent School District in Texas; and University Academy charter school in Kansas City, Missouri used the OECD Test for Schools. The case study explores their reasons for introducing the OECD Test for Schools; the process of implementing it; the benefits for students, teachers, and administrators; and the next steps that the school systems are taking.



Policy and Advocacy Intern


