- Developing a team of teachers who are committed to serving students

SIB Information

- 460 students
- 75% qualify for free or reduced lunch
- 45% Latino, 17% African American, 14% Vietnamese, 14% Caucasion
- 34% English Language Learners (ELL)
- 80% of ELL test at the "intermediate" or below level on the CELDT

English Learner Support Program

- One-on-one assessment and scheduling
- Specific teaching & learning strategies
- Extensive teacher training on language development and student interaction
- Thoughtful placement of ELL students with peer supports
- Intervention meetings
- Extended-day support programs

Results of ELL Program

CAHSEE 10 th Grade Census 2008	All Students SIB	ELL Students SIB	ELL Students District
English	89%	79%	34%
Math	95%	92%	44%

- Highest Academic Performance Index for ELs in the district – 50 points higher than the average
- 94% Graduation Rate

"Fast Track" to College

- Dual-enrollment program between SIB and Mesa College
- Overwhelming majority of students are firstgeneration college-bound
- Classes are taken at the college one period a day

"Fast Track" to College

- All students are expected to participate prior to graduating
- Free to students/families
- Professors are unaware that students are in high school

Statistics for Class of 2008

By February 2008

28% of seniors had 9 college units

By June 2008

- 100% of seniors took at least one three-unit college class.
- 66% of seniors completed 9 college units
- 25% of seniors completed at least 27 college units

Statistics for Class of 2008

- 80% of seniors graduate mid-year and attend
 Mesa College full-time during the spring term
- 96% of seniors in the Class of 2008 attended a college or university in the fall of 2008
- Early graduate program redirects monetary resources to other programs, such as the ELL program

Reasons for Success

- Personalization
- Constantly re-focusing on student needs
- Using data to inform decisions
- Allocation of resources/personnel to the students with the highest need
