
In June, 1998...

 - · an equitable service delivery plan,
 - a viable <u>sustainability</u> plan,
 - and <u>data</u> supporting <u>Return On Investment</u>!



The WLC Model

- An Intermediary between students and opportunities in the community to help them be better informed and better prepared for life and learning beyond high school.
- A professionally staffed, single pointof-contact doing it's "main thing"...making high-quality, ageappropriate career connections.
- Educators and employers need not take time from their "main thing" – helping students learn or providing services and producing goods – to create and manage career exploration opportunities.



Service Delivery


- Seven counties in east, central Iowa

What's Next?

- Because of comprehensive service delivery, sustainability for 15 years, and positive return on investment
 - 2005 Iowa legislation created a policy framework and a fund to replicate intermediary practice across the state
 - 2010 & 2011 seed funds to each community college region
 - 2013 legislation revamped and an annual budget line item of \$3m under current consideration
