Delivery Method

- 1. Projects
- 2. Portfolios
- 3. Extended-performance tasks

Administration

- Single summative assessment, or
- Multiple interim assessments

Accountability

Multiple Measures Accountability System

- 1. Students' performance on statewide assessment,
- 2. High school graduation rates,
- 3. English language proficiency, and
- 4. At least 1 indicator of school quality or success



State & District Plans

• Provide for the effective transition of students from <u>middle</u> school to high school and from <u>high school to</u> postsecondary education, by way of:

- Integrated coursework and work-based learning
- Coordination with higher education and employers
- Increased access to dual enrollment
- Support experiential learning and work-based learning



Professional Development

Professional development funds <u>may be used</u> to support both academic and CTE teachers to implement:

- Dual- or concurrent-enrollment programs, and
- The integration of:
 - Rigorous academics,
 - CTE, and
 - Work-based learning



High School Funding

Use of Title I

- May be targeted to high-poverty high schools
- Up to 3% of state funds for "direct student services":
 - CTE coursework leading to an industry-recognized credential,
 - Advanced coursework,
 - Components of personalized learning

Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grants

• Formula grants that states must reallocate to districts for dropout prevention and other purposes
