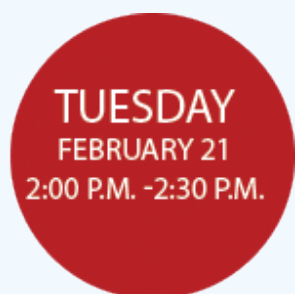

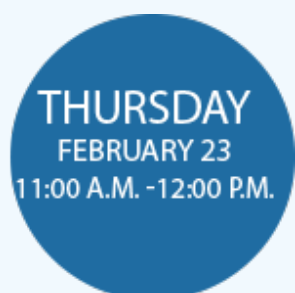
Digital Learning and the Importance of Interoperability and Open Standards

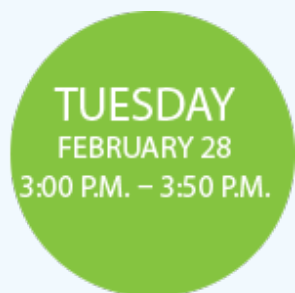
Digital Learning Day Webinar: The Value of a Connected Classroom
