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Education Secretary Betsy DeVos Defends Trump's Education Budget Before Senate Subcommittee

Appearing today before the U.S. Senate subcommittee responsible for federal education funding, Education Secretary Betsy DeVos heard pointed criticism from Republicans and Democrats alike regarding President Trump's education budget, which would cut discretionary funding for the U.S. Department of Education, excluding Pell Grants, by \$5.3 billion or 11.6 percent.

Subcommittee Chairman Roy Blunt (R-MO) called Trump's proposal a "difficult budget request to defend," adding, "I think it's likely that the kinds of cuts that are proposed in this budget will not occur."

Senator Patty Murray (D-WA), the top Democrat on the committee, said Trump's budget proposal "would be devastating for our students and take away opportunities for so many families in this country."




New Alliance-CoSN Resources Highlight Lifeline's Impact on Closing the "Homework Gap"

Approximately 70 percent of teachers assign work that requires students to access the internet after school hours, but nearly onethird of households do not have high-speed internet service, according to data from the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). This lack of service puts students living in these homes at a disadvantage, creating a widening "homework gap" that disproportionately impacts students from low-income families, according to two new resources from the Alliance for Excellent Education and the Consortium for School Networking (CoSN).


