What's Happening with the New Federal Career and Technical Education Law?

There's a new career and technical education law in town. On July 31, 2018, the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act became law, replacing the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act. The new law includes several changes and additions relevant for educators, postsecondary institutions, employers, workforce development boards, community-based organizations

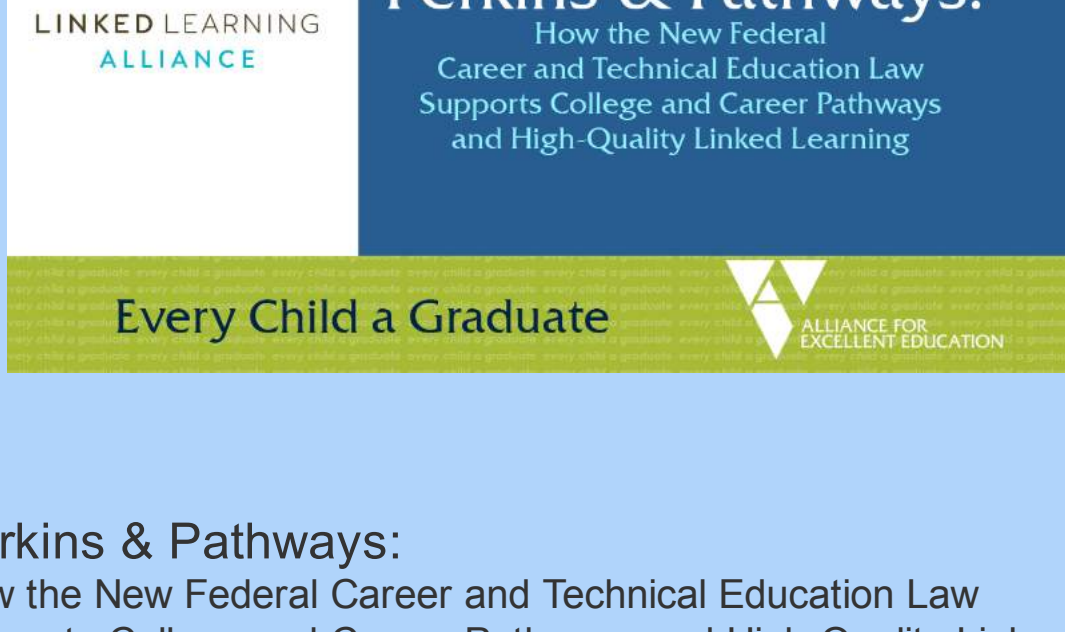

I'm Charged: How to Become a Student-Centered Learning Ambassador

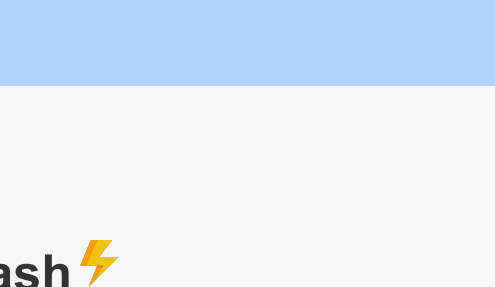
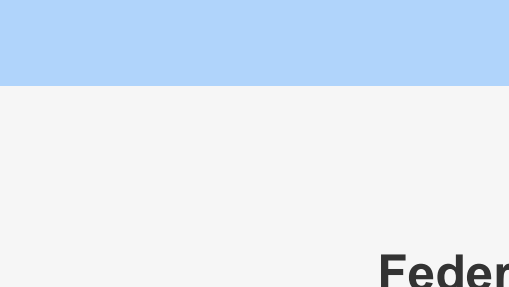

At the International Mind, Brain, and Education Society research conference, All4Ed joined cognitive and neuroscientists in a call for school cultures that better support adolescent development. Adolescence is "coming to be understood as a 'second critical window' for developing skills to regulate emotions, making and evaluating decisions, and judging risk and reward," writes Sarah Sparks in *Education Week*.
