This new Alliance for Excellent Education report summarizes the key developmental changes that adolescents experience in their bodies, brains, relationships, identities, and experiences and explains how those changes impact student learning.

The report also recommends ways that educators and other adults can leverage findings from scientific research to create cohesive learning environments that comprehensively address adolescents' developmental needs.

Perkins Career and Technical Education Primer: Special Populations

The nation's new career and technical education (CTE) lawâ€"the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V) includes specific supports for unique demographic groupsâ€"referred to in the law as "special populations.†These supports are meant to improve their overall academic performance and ensure that more of these students are recruited for and retained in high-quality career and technical education programs.

This fact sheet outlines the student groups included in the law, specific resources in the law to support them, and a new accountability provision for special populations. It also includes information for advocates and states on how to develop a state plan that supports the meaningful improvement of special populations in CTE course work.




